

Visitors behaving inappropriately in the Library may be given a maximum of two warnings and asked to behave in an appropriate manner. Library Staff reserve the right to remove patrons without warning should patron behavior be deemed a threat to the safety or wellbeing of other library users or staff.

Visitors who refuse to behave more appropriately after two warnings will be asked to leave the Library.

Visitors who are suspended from any part of the Library are subsequently suspended from all Library locations and will be escorted out of the building by Library Staff.

The Library staff is authorized to call the police in cases where patrons pose a clear danger to themselves or to others, where there is deliberate violation of the law, or upon refusal to leave the Library after being asked to leave by the staff.

Any visitor who repeatedly violates these rules may be denied the privilege of access to the Library by Library Staff. A visitor whose privileges have been denied may have the decision reviewed by Library Administration.

The Library staff determines when behavior is inappropriate in the Library.

Anyone denied access by the Library who continues to enter the Library will be given a "No Trespass" notice by a Police Officer. Upon failure to heed this notice, patrons may be arrested. At Library Staff discretion, suspensions may be extended or restarted should a visitor enter library buildings before a suspension term is complete.
